The Ceremonial Mace

Saint Xavier University introduced a ceremonial mace to the commencement procession in January 2004. The mace is an ornamental staff that has historically symbolized academic authority and adds to the pageantry of the ceremony. The Saint Xavier University mace consists of a carved walnut staff adorned with the Saint Xavier seal, cast in bronze, and is ushered in by an honored faculty member serving as the grand marshal of the procession. The mace is displayed in the University's Robert and Mary Rita Murphy Stump Library.

Academic Dress and Procession

"The formal academic regalia being worn today had its origin in the clerical costumes of medieval Europe and have evolved into a great variety of patterns and styles. Late in the last century, the American colleges and universities agreed to standardize their regalia; however, there is now a movement to return to individual designs for each institution.

The gown worn by those holding or receiving the bachelor's degree is plain black with pointed sleeves. The master's gown was characterized by a unique, long, closed sleeve with a slit at the elbow, through which the arm protruded; this peculiarity is now being replaced by a sleeve more like that of the bachelor's. The doctoral gown has very full bell sleeves and is trimmed with velvet in panels down the front and in strips across the sleeves. This trim may be either black or in a color that denotes the particular type of doctorate – royal blue for the Ph.D., green for the M.D. and various others.

The familiar mortarboard cap bears only a faint resemblance to its close relative, the clerical biretta. Some institutions now specify a soft cap somewhat like a tam o'shanter. The bachelor's decorate the cap with a tassel in black or the color indicative of the degree. Master's wear black tassels; the doctors wear either black or metallic gold.

Most symbolic and informative of the regalia is the hood, which is no longer raised over the head, but is hung down the back, just as a cleric wore it when baring the head in church. The bachelor's hood is three feet long, the master's is three-and-one-half feet, and the doctor's is four feet long with a rectangular panel, which once served as a shoulder cap when the hood was raised. A curious short tail at the peak of the hood is all that now remains of a long strip, which was wrapped around the throat as a scarf. All of the hoods have a velvet border in the color of the degree according to the same system used for the trim of the doctoral gown.

In the Middle Ages, academic hoods were lined with miniver, lamb's wool or rabbit fur - a necessity in unheated schools and churches. By the 14th century, professors were silk-lined hoods in summer; satin is now used to line the hoods. The colors and patterns of the satin lining of the hood identify the college or university conferring the degree."

Graduation Honors

Due to grade reporting and program printing deadlines, graduation honors are not listed in the commencement booklet. However, graduation honors are announced with the students' names as the diploma is awarded.

To be eligible for graduation honors, students must have completed at least 50 graded semester hours at Saint Xavier University and earned a cumulative grade-point average of:

- 3.50 for Cum Laude (with honors, white Honor Cords)
- 3.70 for Magna Cum Laude (with high honors, silver Honor Cords)
- 3.90 for Summa Cum Laude (with highest honors, gold Honor Cords)


The cumulative GPA is based exclusively on credits earned at Saint Xavier University and is the higher of (a) the GPA for all credits earned at Saint Xavier University or (b) the last 50 hours earned prior to graduation. If the student reaches and exceeds 50 hours in a term, then all courses earned that term are counted in the GPA for the "last 50 hours." The student is not allowed to pick the courses to equal exactly 50 hours. Graduation honors are recognized for undergraduate degrees only.

Honors announced during the commencement ceremonies are anticipated honors based upon grades posted to the student record, excluding the current active semester. The honors posted on the transcript, as part of the student's official record, are based upon grades earned through the final semester. The posted honors may differ from the announced honors.

"Honors Scholar" denotes a student who has completed all requirements of the Saint Xavier University Undergraduate Honors Program, including senior-year research or creative project. "Honors Core" students complete five of their general education requirements with Honors Program faculty.

College of Arts and Sciences Honorary Degree Recipient

Citation honoring Gerald F. Kicanas, D.D., Ph.D.
Bishop Emeritus of the Diocese of Tucson
Upon the conferral by Saint Xavier University of the degree
Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*



Ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago in 1967, The Most Reverend Gerald F. Kicanas has served more than 50 years in a variety of leadership positions helping to give shape to a renewed vision of the educational and ministerial mission of the Catholic Church in the United States.

He was ordained a bishop in 1995 and appointed auxiliary bishop of Chicago serving as episcopal vicar of Vicariate I of the Archdiocese of Chicago. In 2001, he was appointed coadjutor bishop of Tucson and installed as bishop of Tucson in 2003. In 2017, after serving 14 years, he became bishop emeritus of Tucson. In 2017, Kicanas was appointed as the chair of the Board of Directors for the National Catholic Educational

Association and is also currently serving as apostolic administrator to the Diocese of Las Cruces, New Mexico.

Bishop Kicanas assisted in reshaping ministry education in secondary-, collegiate- and graduate-level education for men preparing for parish ministry. He served in various capacities in the seminary system of the Archdiocese of Chicago for 25 years. In 1984, he was appointed rector of Mundelein Seminary and held seminary postings that included rector, principal and dean of formation at the former Quigley Seminary South.

In addition, he served as chairperson of the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops Subcommittee for Lay Ecclesial Ministry, was the episcopal liaison to the National Association for Lay Ministry and former member of the Committee for the Laity. In these capacities, he guided the emergence of lay leadership in the American Church. In recognition of his unique contributions to and impact on the Catholic Church in the U.S., the Catholic Common Ground Initiative awarded Bishop Kicanas with the Cardinal Joseph Bernardin Award in 2008.

Following his service as vice president of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in 2010, Bishop Kicanas served as chair of the Board of Directors of Catholic Relief Services, which put him at the forefront of responding to the international plight of migrants and refugees. Fluent in Spanish and uncompromising in his dedication in addressing immigration, he has been an active participant in the Catholic Legal Immigration Network, Inc.

In light of his many published essays addressing immigration issues and refugee suffering, along with his commitment to the importance of the free press, Bishop Kicanas received the Catholic Press Association's 2018 Bishop John England Award.

Bishop Kicanas's credentials include post-graduate work in several areas, as well as a Ph.D. in Educational Psychology, an M.Ed. in Guidance and Counseling from Loyola University/Chicago and a Licentiate in Sacred Theology from the University of St. Mary of the Lake, Mundelein, Ill.

For his more than 50 years as a priest, Bishop Kicanas has been a premier educator, a champion of Catholic Social Teaching, a promoter of immigration reform, a visionary for a more just and vibrant church, a celebrator of lay leadership and a good friend to the Sisters of Mercy.

For this and other pertinent reasons, we are most pleased to confer on The Most Reverend Gerald F. Kicanas the degree Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*, with all the rights and privileges thereof. Done in Chicago, this eleventh day of May 2019.

The Honorable Terrence A. Duffy serves as chairman and chief executive officer of CME Group, where he is responsible for overseeing the world's leading and most diverse derivatives marketplace. In 2018, CME Group handled more than 4.8 billion contracts.

Duffy has served as executive chairman and president of CME Group since 2012 and as executive chairman since 2007. Previously, he served as chairman of the board of CME and CME Holdings Ltd. since April 2002 and as executive chairman since October 2006. He was vice chairman of the board of CME Holdings Ltd. from its formation in August 2001 and of the board of CME from

1998 to April 2002. He was president of TDA Trading, Inc. from 1981 to 2002. He has been a CME member since 1981 and a board member since 1995.

Duffy was appointed by former U.S. President George W. Bush and confirmed by the U.S. Senate in 2003 as a member of the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board (FRTIB), a position he held until 2013. The FRTIB administers the Thrift Savings Plan, a tax-deferred defined contribution (retirement savings) plan for federal employees.

Named CEO of the Year at FOW's 2018 International Awards, he currently serves as co-chair of the Mayo Clinic Greater Chicago Leadership Council. He also is vice chairman of the CME Group Foundation and president of the CME Group Community Foundation.

Duffy is a member of the Economic Club of Chicago, the Executives' Club of Chicago and the President's Circle of the Chicago Council on Global Affairs. He attended the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater. In 2007, he received a Doctor of Humane Letters from DePaul University.

nothing to delight me, but the hope of coming

to the possession of Thee, my God,

in Thy own everlasting Kingdom. Amen."
